Visiting Faculty Positions Available (UC Faculty)
Location: University of California, Washington Center (UCDC), Washington, DC

The University of California, Washington Center (UCDC) is recruiting for visiting faculty to teach in its undergraduate academic program. UCDC is a system-wide academic program of the University of California in Washington, DC that provides opportunities for undergraduates to study and participate in public service, media, science policy and arts internships in Washington DC for a quarter or semester. Additionally, students carry a course load of academic work including participation in a core research seminar and elective courses. Courses are designed to supplement student's internship experience and/or to take advantage of the many unique opportunities available in our nation's capital.

Applications and course proposals are invited for anticipated Visiting Faculty positions. Areas of specialization include Political Science, International Relations, Economics, Sociology, History, Anthropology, Public Policy, Area Studies, Media, Law, Science Policy and Performing/Fine Arts. Appointments are usually for one term (quarter or semester), though longer periods may be considered.

This is an open and ongoing recruitment for tenured UC faculty. Positions will be filled as necessary. UCDC will keep active applications for all appropriate vacancies for one year. Applicants must resubmit materials each academic year to retain eligibility. Teaching positions are in Washington, DC at the Washington Center. Visiting faculty must relocate to the Washington, DC area for the term of the appointment. Home departments will be provided course relief for each course taught by the Visiting Faculty.

UCDC will provide one round trip airfare and subsidized housing (one bedroom apartment) at the UC Washington Center for the duration of the appointment.
